Contact the appraisal office if you disagree with this year's proposed value for your property or if you have any problems with the property description or address information. If the problem cannot be resolved, you have a right to appeal to the Appraisal Review Board (ARB). To appeal, you must file a WRITTEN protest with the ARB before the protest deadline. Enclosed is a protest form to mail or bring to the appraisal district office at the address above before the above date. You may meet informally with an appraisal district representative anytime prior to your protest hearing to discuss and possibly resolve your issues without going to the ARB hearing. You may have the right to have a protest relating to the property heard by a special panel of the ARB. The ARB will notify you of the date, time and place of your scheduled hearing. Enclosed also is information to help you in preparing your protest. You do not need to use the enclosed form to file your protest. You may protest by letter, if it includes your name, your property description and what appraisal action you disagree with.

Beginning August 7th, visit [Texas.gov/PropertyTaxes](https://www.texas.gov/PropertyTaxes) to find a link to your local property tax database on which you can easily access information regarding your property taxes, including information regarding the amount of taxes that each entity that taxes your property will impose if the entity adopts its proposed tax rate. Your local property tax database will be updated regularly during August and September as local elected officials propose and adopt the property tax rates that will determine how much you pay in property taxes.
